INTRODUCTION

This preliminary guide to research on Asian American history and culture in New England consists of two major sections. The first presents an annotated bibliography (compiled in 2003) on the subject of Asians and Asian Americans in New England. The second lists the results of a screening survey conducted in the spring of 2003 that began charting the “documentary universe” of Asian American history and culture in New England.

The annotated bibliography was developed from electronic databases and recommendations from local scholars. Based on these sources—both primary and secondary, published and unpublished, printed material, audiovisual or electronic—it is possible to conclude that there are three phases in the history of Asians and Asian Americans in New England. In the first phase, Asians are not present in New England, though it is evident that they happen to be very present in the minds of New Englanders. The economic, social and political vitality of New England depended in substantial part on the region’s ability to exploit the material, cultural and intellectual resources of Asia and Asians. The sources grouped in the first part of this bibliography, “New England in Asia,” testify to this historical reality.

The second phase in the history of Asians and Asian Americans in New England occurred not long after New England assumed its leading role among American states in harvesting the products of Asia and Asians. As early as the late eighteenth century, the first Asians began to appear in New England as visitors and immigrants. However, as nineteenth century European imperialism and colonialism helped wreak havoc on Asian societies and peoples, numbers of Asians began looking to the shores of the United States and New England for refuge or opportunity. Nevertheless, not all Asians arrived in New England willingly or voluntarily. Upon their arrival in New England in noticeable numbers, Asians faced hostility and eventually, exclusion. The second part of this bibliography, “Immigration and Exclusion” reflects the realities of this period. Roughly, it covers the century and a half from 1800 to 1945. Against the backdrop of the immigration and exclusion of Asian Americans in New England, New Englanders, however, continued to visit Asia freely, enjoying careers as entrepreneurs, missionaries, teachers, professors, military officers and government officials. In this period, it is clear that Asia, Asians, and *Asian Americans* continued to loom large in the social and economic development of the region. Thus, while the vistas of New England as a region and the United States as a nation were expanding in this era, by contrast Asians and Asian Americans had to confront United States imperialism and colonialism overseas, and exclusion and internment at home.

The final phase in the history of Asians and Asian Americans in New England leads to the present period. The third part of this bibliography, “Communities,” reflects the determination on the part of Asians and Asian Americans in New England to survive and thrive in a region that has not always welcomed or encouraged the presence of their communities. This section of the bibliography attempts to capture a sense of the breadth and variety of Asian and Asian American communities in New England.

The bibliography contained in this preliminary research guide is not full or complete. It is a work in progress. For future editions of this guide, the Institute for Asian American Studies welcomes suggestions for additions or deletions. Also, due to lack of available information in many cases, it was not possible to annotate all of the entries in the bibliography.

As mentioned, the second section of this research guide lists the results of a screening survey conducted in the spring of 2003. This survey attempted to begin charting the “documentary universe” of Asian American history and culture in New England. Survey forms were sent out to approximately 400 archivists and to 400 staff of historical societies throughout New England. Respondents were asked if the archival collections they administered were open to the public and if they included materials on Asian American history and culture in New England. Respondents could: 1) acknowledge that their collections *definitely* included materials on Asian American history and culture in New England; 2) acknowledge that their collections *possibly* included materials on Asian American history and culture in New England; 3) acknowledge that though their collections probably did not include materials on Asian Americans in New England, their respective repository had an interest in developing a collection or archive of these materials in the future; 4) acknowledge that their collections had no Asian Americans in New England materials, and their respective repository also had no interest in developing such a collection or archive of materials in the future. The second section of this research guide therefore consists of three lists: first, the repositories which *probably* contain materials pertinent for researching Asian Americans in New England; secondly, the repositories which *possibly* contain materials on Asian Americans in New England; and finally, the repositories which *expressed an interest* in developing archives or collections on Asian Americans in New England in the future.

I. NEW ENGLAND IN ASIA

"The Lapwing and Other 'Small Tokens of Respect.'" *Dukes County Intelligencer* 1988 30, no. 2: 32-35.

Article about the nature of 19th century political patronage in New England, discussing Daniel Webster's relationship with the influential Forbes family of Massachusetts, wealthy Boston merchants involved in the China trade.

"Shipping Records, 1725-1885."

Places represented in these shipping records include Boston, Massachusetts, Hartford, Connecticut, Rhode Island, and Bengal, India.

Anderson was employed by D.G. & W.B. Bacon & Co., a mercantile shipping firm in Boston, Massachusetts. Papers reflect on the New England trade with Hong Kong, India, Singapore and Indonesia.

Article that discusses why and how the leading Massachusetts merchants entered the China trade and Asia trade. They lost the British West Indian trade after the American Revolution, leaving the base of the New England economy stagnant. Searching desperately for new markets, the post-Revolutionary government under the Articles of Confederation encouraged them to pursue commerce in Asia. The sailing of the *Empress of China* from Boston in February 1784 represented this New England thrust into the China trade, although it was not actually the first penetration of East Asian commerce by Americans. There had been earlier examples. The new American-Chinese trade depended, however, upon Americans' finding something of value to exchange for Chinese goods.

Currier, Charles Chase, 1805-1860. "Correspondence, 1826-1855." 1826-1855.

Currier (1805-1860) was a commercial agent working in Boston and Salem, Massachusetts, and Calcutta, India and Pinang, Malaysia. He worked for the Pingree family of Boston.

Eventually, he learned Chinese, and wrote a history of the United States in Chinese. He founded the journal *Chinese Repository*, which became an important source of American and European knowledge of Chinese culture and politics.
